

We're all familiar with Maryland's sales tax, but far fewer people know anything about the use tax and when they must pay it. In fact, every state with a sales tax also has a use tax. The use tax is imposed on items you paid less than 6% sales tax on when you purchased them outside of Maryland. The use tax requires you to make up the difference in Maryland sales tax.

You can use the form below to report and pay the tax. The tax is due quarterly, and the due dates are shown to the right. If the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, then the return with payment is due on the next business day.

PURCHASES MADE	CONSUMER USE TAX RETURN DUE
January - March	April 20
April - June	July 20
July - September	October 20
October - December	January 20
